Out of necessity, due to the February speaker's last minute illness, display, voting, and discussion of the pink quilts will be the focus of the meeting. If I had had more notice, I might have been able to gin up some sort of program to replace the speaker's absence. Anne will rebook her for later in the year. The best laid plans...

I am currently working to complete a red, white, and blue quilt for a young man (only eight years old) who became a US citizen recently. I found tea towels representing states that have figured in his short life and will piece them into the backing -- South Carolina (where he received his citizenship, Missouri (his grandmother lived a significant part of her life here), and Washington, D.C.

My daughter asked for a quilt to include in a silent auction for a worthy cause. Do you have a quilt "just lying around" that you could donate?" MARCH MEETING 3/8/2024, 7:00 pm

The March Guild Meeting will feature **Dorothy Pino** of Sew, La, Tea Music & Crafts, LLC (<u>https://www.sewlateastl.com/</u>). Dorothy teaches sewing, among other arts and crafts, and has been hosting classes for young people at the City Sewing Room for several years. I invited her to speak to us because one of her teaching strategies is to use quilt-piecing as a means of building sewing-machine proficiency: first, new students sew together pre-cut squares of fabric to make a patchwork pillow or throw. Later, they "graduate" to foundation paper piecing to make quilt-block pictures while practicing straight-stitch seam control. Her classes are lively and fun, and I wanted her to share some of her stories with the Guild.

And just a little hint ... if you enjoy workshops, please consider volunteering for the

Workshop Committee (not an elected position, but you can still tell the Board Member who calls you to ask you to run for office that you are already committed to a leadership position!)

We will also have attendance and fabric raffles plus our SECOND "Optional Block" raffle (\$1 plus a block buys you a chance to win; \$5 plus 6 blocks buys you 6 chances!) and a new block pattern for March (pattern direction handouts are free). Don't forget the free table, Show and Tell, and your name tag!

MARCH WORKSHOP 3/16/2024, 11:00 am - 2:00 pm

Dorothy will also host a <u>FOUNDATION PAPER PIECING WORKSHOP</u> at the Shrewsbury Center – the cost will be **\$45 per person**. Sign up at Guild Meeting [bring cash or a check], or please contact Co-VP Anne Hennig (<u>henniganne07@gmail.com</u> – please put T&T WORKSHOP in the SUBJECT line). If this sounds like fun but notice is too short, let Anne know – I may be able to arrange another workshop later in the Spring or early Summer.

FUTURE MEETINGS

Later in the Spring we have a couple of presentations on fabric embellishment. **Nita Pace** will speak to us about techniques like Sashiko (Japanese decorative stitching for mending or joining fabric pieces) and similar stitching traditions from Africa that can enhance or complement the designs printed on pieces of cloth. **Anne Stirnemann** from the City Sewing Room will speak to us about Alabama Chanin hand-crafted design, committed to sustainability, local and ethical production, and preservation of craft traditions.

Over the summer our presentations will get back to more traditional piecing techniques. **Brita Nelson, the Questioning Quilter** (<u>https://questioningquilter.com/</u>) will speak to us via ZOOM in July about "The Magic of Disappearing Blocks". I hope our Guild will host one of her Disappearing Block workshops sometime in the future.
