We sewed rail fence blocks to make twin-sized quilts for Ukraine. Some members brought sewing machines, others sorted and cut strips, ironed, fetched, and carried.

Liza Mitchell color coordinated fabric. Everyone worked to their strengths, and we had to set a time limit for packing up and leaving. Suffice it to say we were in our happy place!

Members said they would like to do this again, and we will. I took home enough pieces and blocks to sew a top together, plus a couple of baggies of 5" novelty squares. Each piece was different and will make an I Spy quilt for a little one. I have already sewn one set together. No thinking involved. It made for pleasant Zen sewing.

As the weather warms up, outside tasks are calling. Since having back issues, I have used a garden service for the big jobs – raking leaves, spreading mulch, and weekly mowing. Still, there seems to be small things to do. When the weather is pleasant, it's nice to do what I can.

There still seems to be time for quilting, though!

Currently I have been making baby quilts for donation. I finished the kits I had made by Jeanette O and her posse. I ordered several sale fabrics for backings from equilter.com at \$5 to \$6 per yard. I could piece fabrics for backings, which for smallish baby quilts isn't a big task. I really dislike that particular job, so I tend to avoid it.

The rail fence project is calling my name as well and that will be next up when I get back home from Kansas City.

There was a fabric placement station where 2"x8" strips were assembled for the sewers and there was a cutting table for cutting the donated fabric into strips. After piecing, the blocks were pressed at the ironing station.
