Thimble and Thread Retreat 2020

It's not too early to being thinking about Thimble and Thread's retreat at the Pallottine Center next year. The dates will be September 18, 19, and 20. The date of the workshop is April 18 and will be held at the American Legion Hall, 314 Clay Ave., Kirkwood, MO from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm.
